What do we do? – Stay in your car, eat snacks, and enjoy the show!





Indiana 2020-2021 Required and Recommended School Immunizations

Please send in your student's updated immunization record/dates. <u>Notes have been sent home with those students whose school records are not current.</u>

Without receiving required immunizations that protect children from diseases like measles and whooping cough, your student remains at risk. As Dr. Kristina Box (Indiana State Health Commissioner) has said repeatedly, immunizations are still important. The last thing we need is an epidemic of pertussis, measles, meningitis, etc. coming out right now.

We are committed to the prevention of vaccine-preventable disease by adhering to Indiana Code 20-34-4-5. This code highlights the expectation that students must be fully immunized unless they provide a religious objection, medical exemption, or if extreme circumstances prevent them from receiving a vaccine.

Please call the School Nurse and share the date of your student's appointment to receive his/her Past Due immunizations.



EMERGENCY MEDICATION/SUPPLIES AT SCHOOL OR IN BOOK BAG AT ALL TIMES

Reminders have been sent home with your student about Emergency Medications. Please remember to bring Emergency Medications to school as well as checking the Expiration Dates on the Prescription Label and the Medication itself. Emergency Medication would include: Diastat, Midazolam, Inhalers, Glucagon, or any Emergency Medication your student might require. This would include spare G-tube kits.

If an Emergency Medication is not at school or is expired, 911 will be called if necessary.



MEDICAL INFORMATION FORMS & EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION FORMS

Please return your student's Green Medical Information Form or Emergency Contact Information Form that have been sent home. It is vital to have this information on file in the School Clinic, especially during these unprecedented times. The Medical Information Form not only provides valuable information, but also allows your student to receive Over-the-Counter medications and First Aid.

Please sign and return with your student any Medical Plans sent home with your student. Please make any necessary changes to the Health Care Action Plan sign and return with your student.
