January School Clinic Newsletter

IMMUNIZATIONS

The 2020-2021 school year has certainly been different, but <u>immunizations</u> are still required, that has not changed. Those students who are using an e-learning or virtual platform, the <u>immunization</u> requirements remain the same. I encourage you to remain committed to the prevention of vaccine-preventable disease by adhering to Indiana Code 20-34-4-5. If your student's Immunization record is incomplete, a letter was sent home with your student. Please send record of updated immunization dates to the school nurse or call with any questions.

VISION SCREENING

According to VisionQuest 20/20, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization dedicated to protecting children from undetected vision disorders and preventable causes of blindness, it has been estimated that as much as 80% of learning occurs visually. Currently, vision disorders are the 4th most common childhood disability in the United States with one in four children suffering from a vision problem. Early detection and treatment of a vision problem is critical to your child's educational success, health and wellbeing. Vision Screening reports have been sent home with students who were referred to an eye care professional. Please send these completed reports to the school nurse.

HEARING SCREENING

The American Academy of Audiology endorses detection of hearing loss in early childhood and schoolaged populations using evidence-based hearing screening methods. Hearing loss is the most common developmental disorder identifiable at birth and its prevalence increases throughout school-age due to the additions of late-onset, late identified and acquired hearing loss. Hearing screenings during childhood are vital for early identification and management of hearing loss. Hearing screenings in schools play an important role in identifying children who may have hearing loss, putting them at risk for poor academic performance unless intervention and appropriate management is provided. Even a minimal hearing loss can make it hard for a child to listen and learn in a classroom. A Hearing Screening report has been sent home with students who were referred for a medical evaluation with their physician. Send these completed reports to the school nurse.

MEDICAL INFORMATION/EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION FORM

These Back-to-School Forms have been sent home with your student for you to complete. The <u>MEDI-CAL INFORMATION FORM</u> is needed to get up-to-date information about your student's current condition, medications, and his/her overall health. We make this information available for the paramedics to relay to the hospital should 911 need to be called. This form also allows your student to receive listed over -the-counter medication or first aid treatment. The <u>EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION FORM</u> helps keep track of people to contact in case of emergency, authorized people to pick up students, hospital preference, and other necessary information.

SPARE MEDICAL SUPPLIES/EMERGENCY MEDICATIONS

Forms were sent home with your student sharing extra supplies, equipment, or emergency medications needed to be kept at school. Please remember to make sure we have all that is needed to keep your student safe and healthy.

Follow-up forms will be sent home within the next few weeks, please check your student's back pack.
